 “The Sixth Trumpet”

Intro: The Bible’s emphasis on repentance

- John the Baptist & Jesus: Both started their ministries with calls to repentance.
- Repentance & saving faith in Jesus Christ: Like two sides of the same coin.
- Repentance: A change of mind about sin that leads to a turn from sin and a turn to Jesus as Lord of one’s life.
- God’s judgments: Meant to lead sinners to repentance.

We must marvel at the _____ of heart displayed in the stubborn refusal to _____ despite _____ from God that are designed to promote repentance.

- The last three trumpets: Referred to as ‘three woes.’
- The voice declaring that it’s time to release the four angels: Quite likely the voice of the risen and triumphant Savior.

- The fact that the four angels are ‘bound’: A very strong clue that they are actually fallen.
- Beyond the boundary of the Euphrates: Where the enemies came from for the Jews and for the Romans.
- The demons activity since the ascension of Jesus Christ into heaven: Inciting all kinds of wars, conflicts, and violence.
- The demonic calvary seen by John: Gets their marching orders from the great dragon himself.
- John’s vision: Apparently draws from the 46th chapter of Jeremiah’s prophecy.
- ‘Fire, smoke, and sulfur’: The language of destruction.
- A key point to remember: Know repentance, know salvation; no repentance, no salvation.
